CHIROPRACTIC X-RAY METHOD PUBLISHED IN SPINE AS 3-PART SERIES

After his undergraduate pre-chiropractic courses at the University of Utah, Dr. Deed Harrison graduated from Life West in 1996. He is co-author of more

than 40 peer-reviewed, indexed, research articles. These include 27 in JMPT, 3 in Chiropractic Technique, and 12 at major Index Medicus journals. He is a reviewer for an Index Medicus Orthopaedic journal. He is a certified instructor for CBP® Seminars, has written three new CBP® text books, and is Vice-President of CBP® Nonprofit, Inc. He has a private practice in Elko, Nevada.

For the first time ever, a Chiropractic x-ray line drawing method has been published in a medical/orthopedic journal. A 3-part series on our Harrison Posterior Tangent radiographic method has been published in Spine in 2000 and 2001. This makes CBP®'s 4th publication in Spine since our Harrison cervical spine model was published in Spine in 1996 and our recent

lateral cervical reliability project (part 1 of our 3-part series) was published in an August 2000 issue of Spine.

In January and February 2001, I received acceptance letters for two CBP® research papers from Dr. James Weinstein, Editor-in-Chief at Spine. These two projects were (1) Centroid,

ICA Congressional Initiatives Seek to Open Up New Access to Chiropractic Services

FROM THE INTERNATIONAL CHIROPRACTORS ASSOCIATION
EXCLUSIVE TO CLINICAL CHIROPRACTIC JULY 9, 2001

Legislation has been introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives at the request of the International Chiropractors Association aimed at opening up new access to chiropractic services for upwards of 20 million Americans through the Medicare and Federal Employees Health Benefits programs. These two initiatives represent responsible, practical and affordable policy enhancements that, when enacted, will make a major difference in the chiropractic economy in the United States and in the quality of health care and quality of life for millions of our citizens.

MEDICARE: H.R. 2284, introduced by Representative John Lewis (D-GA), will expand the list of services reimbursed under Medicare to include examinations and x-ray services. This landmark bill will also provide that only doctors of chiropractic are authorized to deliver chiropractic services under Medicare.

"This important legislation represents a major step forward for the chiropractic patient in that it removes the practical barriers that have kept millions of Medicare beneficiaries from realistic access to chiropractic services," said ICA President Dr. D.D. Humber. "In order to provide the care our senior citizens need, examinations and imaging procedures such as x-rays are absolutely essential for the provision of quality chiropractic care. When

At a special session board meeting of CBP® Non-profit, Inc., the Board of Directors voted unanimously in favor of funding a research grant proposal submitted by Tony Keller, Ph.D., and Chris Colloca, D.C. The proposal entitled, *A Biomechanical and Neurophysiological Investigation of Spinal Manipulation on Trunk Muscle Hyperactivity*, is an exciting collaboration with a top-notch international research team to answer an important question for chiropractic. The study is slated to begin this fall at Sahlgrenska University Hospital's Department of Orthopaedics in Göteborg, Sweden in conjunction with Dr. Sten Holm and co-investigators.
